Victoria Telehandler Training Courses - Employers are responsible for making sure that their supervisory and operating personnel are trained to work competently using telehandler machinery. The competence level of employees have to be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that workers attain the necessary level of ability. The level of responsibility of the person must be considered when training is provided. Effective training will solve whichever deficiencies in the knowledge, skills and understanding of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training could be undertaken through in-house session or by engaging the services of an external training provider. An assessment upon finishing the training period would determine whether or not the learning objectives have been met.

Regulations and guidelines for the basic telehandler operator testing and training are set by state/provincial, local and federal regulators. Basic training does not deal with such subject matters as the lifting of persons, the lifting of suspended loads, utilizing various attachments, or the utilization of rotating equipment. Further training must be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work location.

Maintenance and Inspection

Like whichever machinery, a telehandler needs effective maintenance. The machine inevitably will suffer wear sooner or later. Right maintenance is essential to ensuring safe utilization of the telehandler machine. Inspections and checks are essential to ongoing maintenance measures. Operators must have machine-specific training in order to rectify, monitor and prevent problems associated with damage, wear and deterioration. Employees require experience and competence in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The preventive maintenance instructions of the manufacturer should be seriously viewed and followed, considering such factors as environmental circumstances in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the machine along with the owner of the machine share the responsibility for making certain that the telehandler is in full working condition. General maintenance is normally done by the telehandler owner whilst pre-use checks are normally performed by the user.
